

Birgitta Sundström Jansdotter

Powerful, tough, challenging, tempting and at the same time vulnerable women play the leading role in the works of Swedish born Birgitta Sundström Jansdotter. Virtuous in her use of art, with historical and contemporary pop culture elements. Jansdotter's hybrid paintings tell us stories about the joys and sorrows of human relationships. She places emphasis on the roles and stereotypes women have been traditionally assigned, find themselves in now and should be claiming for themselves in future. Birgitta paints monumental, and with a cheeky wink to the 'normal' rules in painting. Through the hard-edged compositions, minimal pattern, and simplified shapes, the eyes gain the most prominent value. Centralized in the painting and seems to be mirroring the spectator. Often finding recourse in humor, she approaches the subjects combined with the dark side of life, lingering with hope. Missing her native country, she incorporates parts of the Swedish mysterious landscape rich in symbols and myths rendered by imagination and her memories.

Jansdotter has exhibited worldwide in museums, galleries and art fairs from South Korea and Hong Kong, United States, England, Sweden, Italy, Belgium, Spain, Germany and the Netherlands. Jansdotter has received two Art Prizes in Sweden. In the Netherlands she has been awarded the Jacob Hartog Prize (2007) and the Culture Award of Zuidplas (2017).

Birgitta's art contains hidden powers of the raw Scandinavian landscape with wild animals from Viking Nature. Like the wolf as an archetype and symbol of strength. We activate archetypes unconsciously, intuitively because they are rooted in our intuition. "The Scandinavian Viking culture also resonates with me as a Swedish woman. Strong female warriors with a good position in society. Their role was not limited to bearing and raising children.

My intuition guides me through the long creative process, translating and repeating itself and finally my paintings reveal themselves with their own unique story.

"I grew up in Sweden as a person with equal rights. It feels like my life mission to get this message out. This was also my inspiration for my "Last Supper." Women taking their seats at the table.

I want to give women a place in history to rewrite history through my paintings. There were so many strong women in history but they didn't get the proper attention, except for a few women in some history books. Women are also not much represented in the museums. I want to balance that by painting only women. They get the leading role: Women in war, women in corona times, women in different life situations, angels, nuns and so on.

Nature, animals and women are not treated respectfully and equally. The balance in the world is gone. There are now high temperatures, forest fires, bad weather,

earthquakes, floods, war, diseases and various abuses. Until we discover that everything is connected, intertwined. Everything is energy and we choose to be driven by money and take us off balance
